
Mission Statement

Services are fashioned to support each indivdual to pursue his/her own self-directed life goals.

From the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

CSS celebrates the many achievements of fiscal year 2015 and continues to strengthen the infrastructure necessary to manage new challenges which arise with each new year. Our strength comes from a strong leadership team, committed and highly trained direct support professional staff, supportive friends and family members, and individuals with diverse skills and interests. CSS has maintained its focus on the provision of high quality, individualized, and inclusive support services. Our priority is to minimize clinical or regulatory obstacles with each individual plan so that each person experiences seamless transitions and supports designed to effectively meet their own self-directed goals.

In FY15, CSS supported 95 individuals in residential services, 154 individuals in day services, 13 individuals in nonpublic education services, and 120 individuals in home or community services. While the total number of children and adults supported continues to increase, CSS has maintained a model of small, integrated settings in which to provide services. While receiving residential support services, individuals usually live with one housemate in typical neighborhoods in upper Montgomery County. Each residence reflects the interests and preferences of the individuals who live there, and a schedule of activities is designed which implements each person's individual plan. Individuals are included in community volunteer and paid work sites in a wide variety of settings depending on each person's skills and interests. Opportunities are available in all aspects of community life for individuals to be included depending on their goals. Each person's team examines options and strives to mitigate challenges on an ongoing basis to promote an inclusive life.

Achievements in FY15 include:

- CSS successfully completed a pilot transportation project demonstrating that an alternative to regular paratransit service was cost effective for the state of Maryland as well as provided superior service to each customer
- Purchased 10 houses and sold 1 house in order to maintain safe and attractive living environments for those receiving residential services
- Identified a commercial space and negotiated a lease to start a deli, which would open in the fall of 2015, employing individuals supported by CSS.
- · Expanded nutrition and cooking instruction with the development of "What's for Dinner," and other instructional meal preparation.

CSS moves into FY16 knowing it has a vital role in the lives of Montgomery County citizens with significant developmental

- Advocate for essential services, meeting the specific needs of individuals
- Support innovative models of services while identifying new resources
- Adjust administrative procedures to maintain the high quality of services despite implementation of the new Community Pathways waiver, changing regulations and standards
- Continue building community partnerships and coalitions to increase involvement, integration and awareness



Public Support and Revenue







Performance

Strengthening Services

The monthly status system monitors program quality in critical areas on an ongoing basis. Each residential, educational and employment site is observed and evaluated by a program supervisor each month. The rating for each site is shared with all staff and areas needing improvement are reviewed and corrected. The agency's overall average on the monthly status for the fiscal year is 85% compared to 90% last fiscal year. The decrease from FY14 is due to the implementation of a higher standard of excellence and increasing the level of detail used in evaluations. At the end of FY15, 32% of the sites evaluated averaged above 90%.







Performance

The CSS Board of Directors conducts an annual satisfaction survey as part of the internal evaluation of quality. Individuals, family members and staff rate their level of satisfaction on specific areas of services with residential, supported employment and children's services. A rating of 4 indicates that the respondent is highly satisfied and a 1 indicates a low level of satisfaction with that item. CSS services have maintained a consistent level of satisfaction, between satisfied and highly satisfied (3-4) each year since inception.

Spotlight on Services



Aaron is a 25 year old man who receives Supported Employment and CSLA services with CSS. Aaron's schedule, designed by his family and team, includes extended day and weekend support. Aaron volunteers with Food and Friends in Washington, DC three days a week where he organizes food donations. He also works part time with Catfish Studios touching up furniture and starting new creations. Aaron is part of the "What's for Dinner" vocational group where he puts together dinner kits for individuals to prepare at home. Aaron enjoys a variety of community activities with his peers; he travels on the metro and takes community walks and shops at local stores. On Saturdays, Aaron explores local restaurants, town centers, and festivals. Aaron is engaged in a variety of activities at CSS, including language therapy, functional reading and fitness groups. In his spare time, Aaron works on his computer skills and enjoys going to the local library and reading.

Spotlight on Services

Kyle, 23, successfully transitioned to CSS adult residential and day services in 2013 after graduating from the Marcia D. Smith School. Kyle lives in Gaithersburg with his housemate where he receives continuous support. In his leisure time, Kyle watches television, listens to music, takes walks, hikes with friends in Montgomery County and goes swimming at local swim centers. He receives music therapy services and enjoys piano lessons. Kyle has been learning to cook and has been preparing new foods following recipes. This last year, Kyle has been building social relationships and hosting parties at his home. With consistent, intensive staff support, Kyle volunteers at the St. George Orthodox Church in Bethesda and works a data entry position two days a week. Kyle's CSS team and family coordinate closely with psychiatric and psychological service providers to develop treatment strategies that enable him to live and work as safely and independently as possible in the community. Kyle enjoys visits with his family and spends holidays and special occasions with them.

She likes playing basketball, soccer, loves dancing and her favorite activity is the swimming pool. Sarah goes shopping every day as part of her schedule. Sarah has been learning personal boundaries, practicing patience, respecting personal property, making reasonable requests and sharing age appropriate experiences with peers. The extensive wrap around supports she receives, in addition to her educational program through MCPS, enables Sarah to continue to live safely at home with her family.

George aged out of the Marcia D. Smith School in June of 2015, and was approved by the Developmental Disabilities Administration to receive adult day and personal support services from CSS beginning July 1. George made significant progress in his last year of school services to develop skills needed to transition to different environments and activities. He began regularly making a purchase in the grocery store, completing vocational tasks, participating in a cooking class, and using Metro Access transportation. George received in home supports through the autism waiver while in school, and his family desired to design adult support services for him to continue to live at home. George benefits from intensive psychological and psychiatric services and he lives safely with his family and participates in community based services.
